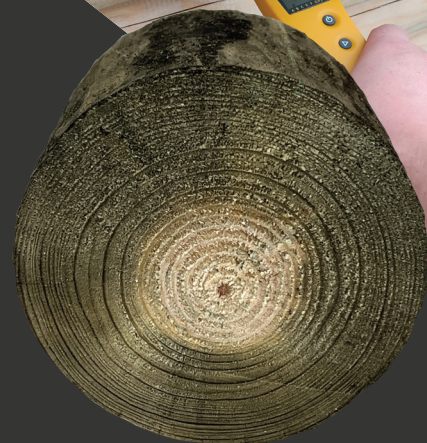

The Premier Platinum range features fence stakes which are treated to NHSS4*, exceeding the typical UC4 treatment level used for domestic projects.

The Premier Platinum stakes undergo a kiln drying process before treatment, removing moisture in the wood to allow it to better absorb the preservative treatment. The stakes are then pressure-treated overnight, which is well over the treatment time applied to standard UC4 products.

This combination of kiln drying and extending the treatment time results in an impressive 30-year desired service life, double that of UC4, making Premier Platinum the perfect choice for long-term agricultural applications.
